


SCUBAnauts Uniforms

It is important to be in uniform at all SCUBAnauts events. It makes our group readily identifiable and conveys a professional image. Some events, like outreach and CHOW, require a formal uniform, which is your navy polo (red for adults), nametag, any rank pins earned, and khaki pants, shorts, or skirt. For other events like monthly meetings, you may wear your polo or SNI t-shirt. Your chapter president or the event leader will tell you when a formal uniform is required.

All nauts receive one t-shirt, one polo, and one rash guard when joining. Additional uniforms as well as other SNI apparel can be ordered at dixiekdesigns.com/collections/scubanauts. Additional rash guards may be requested through your chapter president.

Water Uniforms

Any brand of sport bathing suit is permitted for SNI events, so long as it meets conservative, athletic-style standards of the appropriate solid color. **Nauts wear navy and adults wear red or black.** Note: it can be difficult to find solid navy suits that are economical. Small accent lines or markings down the side are acceptable, so long as the dominate color is navy.

Boys and men should dress in swim trunks of an appropriate length. Many boys prefer trunks with built-in compression shorts (see example photo on next page.) Others may prefer to wear mid-thigh, fitted competition swimsuits (see example photo below) and wear regular shorts, swim trunks, or leggings over them when not in a wetsuit. This can be more comfortable to tuck into a wetsuit than traditional swim trunks. A minimum length of mid-thigh for fitted swimsuits is required and may only be worn alone while in the water for annual swim tests. At ALL other times, appropriate loose-fitting shorts, swim trunks, or a wetsuit must be worn over top of them.

Girls' and women's bottoms should be of a "boy-short" cut or longer and may not rely on side ties or bows to keep them together. This length can be achieved through the actual swimsuit style or cut, or by adding navy board shorts or other athletic shorts over the suit. Girls' tops should also be appropriate for athletic activity and not be secured by ties or bows.

If you cannot do 10 jumping jacks in your swimsuit and have all your parts remain in place, your suit is not appropriate. Think competitive swimwear! If in doubt, please consult an adult leader before purchasing your swim uniform. It is critical that we are professional in our appearance as scientific divers.

Some acceptable style and color choices are shown on the next page.

All divers will also visibly wear an SNI rash guard on all dives. When wearing a wetsuit, the rash guard is worn over the wetsuit so the rash guard and SNI logo remain visible. Rash guards are not required during annual swim tests. Nauts and diving adults all wear navy. Dive professionals wear red for easy identification within the group. These can be purchased from your chapter leadership.
